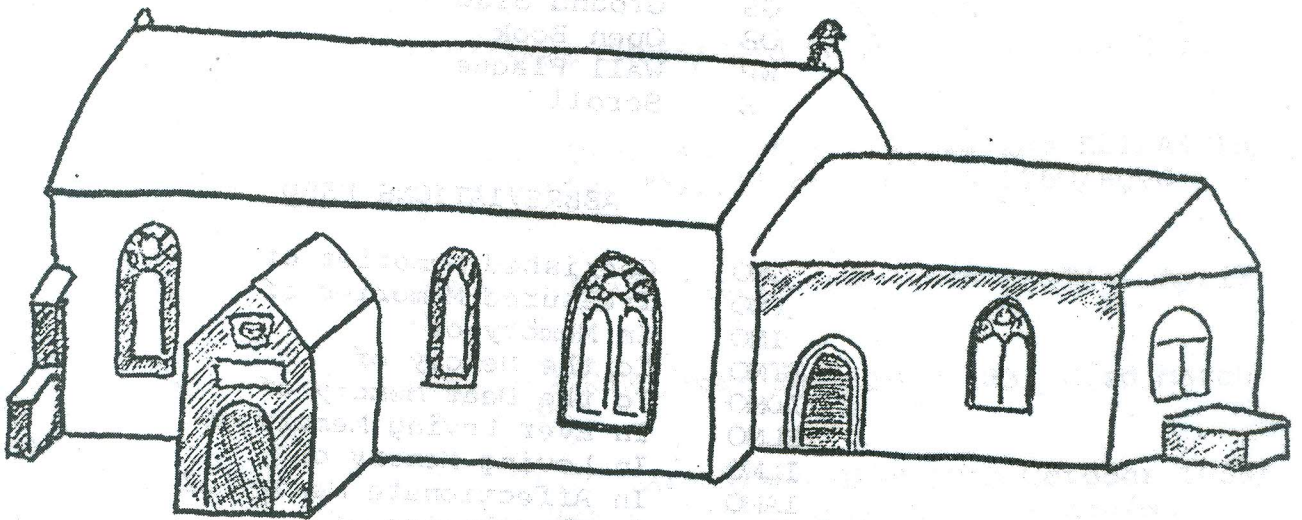

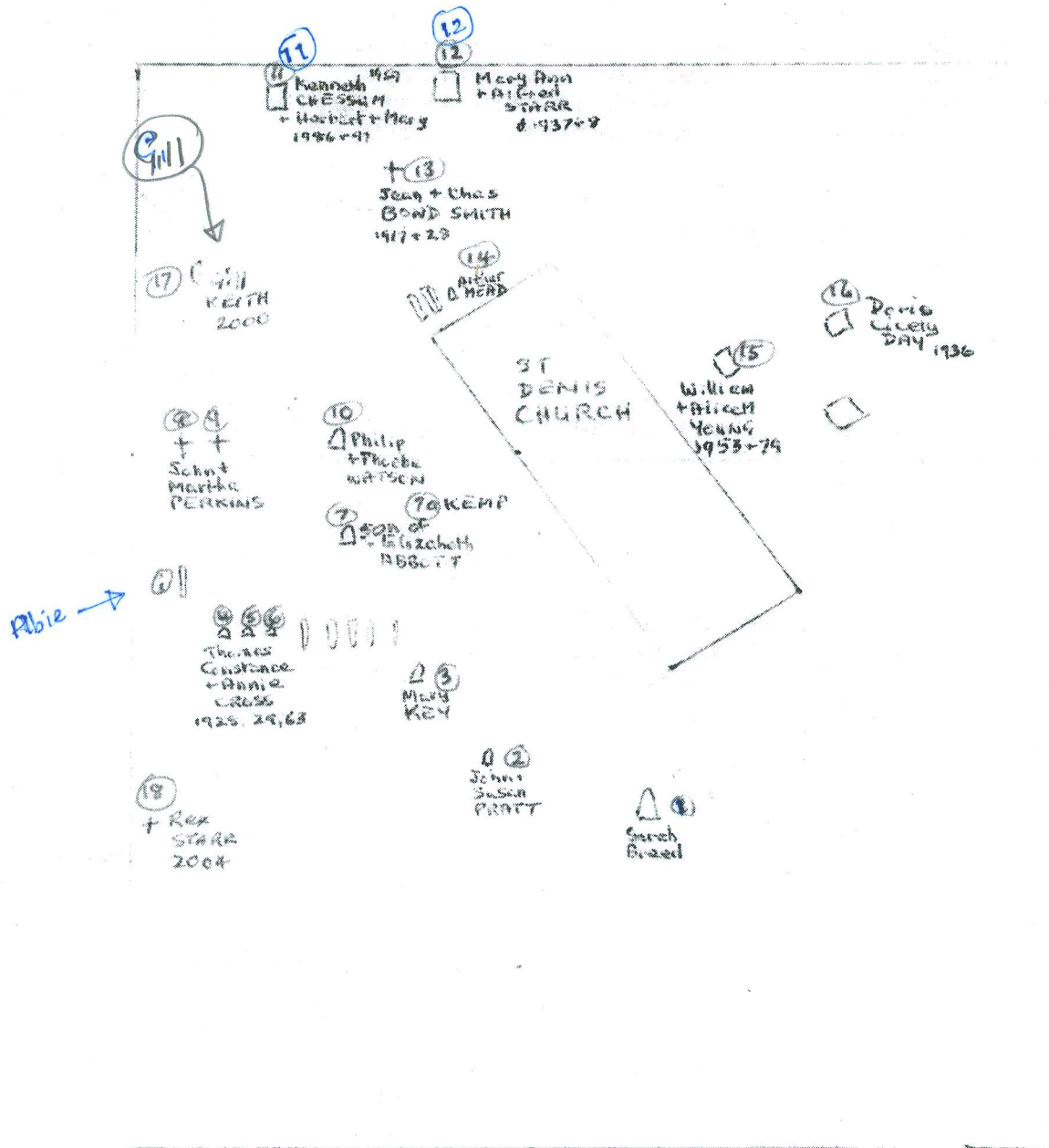

THE CHURCH OF ST DENIS consists of chancel and nave, of the respective dates of 1260 and 1200; it is small but well-proportioned, having some elegant lancet windows in the nave, of mixed styles, with a bell having a plain Latin cross inscribed upon it; the fabric has had a new roof, encaustic tile floor, stained open benches, 3 stained windows, and was re-opened in 1874: there are some memorials to the CASTELL family, the former owners of the estate.
