From Hilary:

Our Harvest week ends this Sunday, proceeds from our Harvest Gifts are being taken in Everton to the Prebend Centre and in Gamlingay shared between Need and the Food Bank. Any proceeds from sale of produce in Gamlingay will also go to the charities.

Remembering Service, All Souls/Memorial and Remembrance Sunday

These are three different occasions with slightly different emphases, so here is the heads-up for which to engage with:

Remembering Services are planned for both parish churches on the last Sunday in October (25th). That Sunday can also be a Dedication Festival, where the actual dedication date for a church isn't known, so there will be an element of that in the services too.

We are using this occasion for church family to say 'good bye' to those who have died during the Covid crisis. Although not a funeral (so not limited to 30 people), the hope is that, as we remember people in a personal way, there will be some closure for people connected with our church who have been unable to attend a funeral. In Gamlingay, Valerie Miller and I will lead a time of remembering individuals by name and with short tributes as part of the 9.30am Benefice Holy Communion. It will be possible to attend for the remembering time only, or to do so and stay on for Communion. The earlier part of the service will contain the elements required for the first part of a Communion service, ending with the Peace. Those wishing to receive communion will stay for a further 15 minutes or so for the prayer of consecration and distribution, there will be opportunity to go at the Offertory when some suitable music or a hymn will be played.

The service at Everton will be at 4pm, details are still awaiting confirmation.

We already have a list of people to include, but do be in touch if you have someone who funeral you have not been able to attended in the last 6 months, so we can make sure they are included.

We will do our absolute best to make the services visible on Zoom as well as for those attending personally, but beware our unreliable internet signal.

This service is not to be confused with the **All Souls/Memorial Services** which take place the following week. Names will be remembered at these services too, but there will not be any personal memories shared, those remembered may have died at any time and we expect there to be many more names. The service at Gamlingay will be an All Souls Communion on Monday at 7.30pm. The service at Everton for this occasion is in the evening of All Saints Day (Sunday 1st November) at 4pm and may include communion depending on the need.

Remembrance Sunday

Is on Sunday 8th November (nearest Sunday to 11th November which is the following Wednesday). In Gamlingay the local Council and Baptist and Anglican Church leaders plus other will be meeting soon to sort out details of what can be done. We do know it won't be the usual arrangements as neither church has the capacity for the service to take place.

We feel fairly confident to predict that there will be an Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial, followed by some form of gathering, possibly outside. More details will be published as advice is available and has been digested. In Everton the service and Act of Remembrance is expected to follow the pattern of previous years, Chris Miller is kindly leading that service.

Whatever emerges, we expect that the churches will be decorated with the poppies produced last year. Additional poppies are welcome, drop them in at the churches when they are open, or in Gamlingay, additionally, at the Rectory, in the first instance.
