Remembering those who have died

When I commissioned this painting from my sister Marcelle I asked her to produce something which was not specifically religious, but which would be a tribute to those who had died. I wanted something we could use that included Remembrance Sunday but was not specific to it. I suppose it was in the back of my mind that this might end up as a tribute to my sister herself, but not that it would be in use that way so soon. We had hoped that the effects of the treatment that had brought her back to us at this time last year would last longer, and even be followed by something that could give her still more time. Alas, that was not to be, but we give thanks for the extra time she had, which included making this work of art.

The picture is intended to stand on its own but is full of symbolism. The flowers and foliage in the picture are all connected with remembering and grief and include poppies for Remembrance Day. There are impressionistic suggestions of other symbols too - a yellow ribbon on the candle, the dove of peace/Holy Spirit taking flight in the light, the candle itself, light shining in darkness, and knots in the grass reminiscent of barbed wire.

Remembrance Sunday

As has become usual in these strange times, no sooner have we published a plan than it has to be changed. Lockdown 2 has meant Remembrance Sunday's arrangements have changed. At first we were told 'no gatherings of any size indoors or out' then we have been told that, with many caveats, a minimal number of people can gather at a public War Memorial under the auspices of the local authority.



At Everton the ceremony at the War Memorial in the churchyard will still take place but with very few people on site and will include elements of the service which would have taken place in the church buildings. The church will be open for prayer and lighting a candle by individuals during the day and on November 11th.

The silence will be observed with the help of the ringing of the church bell (which can be heard all around the village) either side of the 2 minutes silence. Individuals are encouraged to observe the silence on their doorsteps.

In Gamlingay the ceremony at the War Memorial will <u>not</u> now take place in the usual way. Filming has taken place in advance before restrictions came in, with laying of wreaths and the reading of names. This will be broadcast along with a service at the Baptist church. The only people present will be Adrian and myself leading and preaching with technical support.



All our churches will still be open for private prayer and decorated with poppies both on Sunday and the following week, up to and including Remembrance Day itself.
