The Jesse symbols are being used again this year for each day in Advent starting on Sunday and will be shared round Gamlingay village. Some are already prepared by the Sparks children for display in shops and other locations. Please let Sandra, Sarah or Hilary know if you would like to take part. You need to have a front-facing window and, if you sign up to host a window, we will deliver the card number and picture for you to decorate. You can use glitter/paint/pens etc., to decorate the picture so that it represents a gift and then display it in your window on the day of the number on the card. We would then ask you to take a photo and post it onto the St Mary's Facebook page adding a comment and the reading details to the post.


