We are now in Epiphany Season, just as the country comes to terms with rapidly rising cases of the new strain of Covid 19. The themes of the season are an important antidote to the general mood-lowering of January which can be hard going at the best of times but particularly as we are told, once again, to stay at home.

So, let us follow the light, keep tending to our own souls and in so doing support one another in hope, peace, joy and love.

### **Church Services January**

Public worship is still permitted but that does not mean it is always advisable. In our rural setting we believe we are still OK at Gamlingay with the measures we can take and that are in place, but please think about whether it is right for you to attend.

Services are available on Zoom links. For Wednesdays, a weekly repeat link is in place; a Sunday link is published weekly.

**For those who do attend in person, please follow the instructions:**

- **Do not mingle and socialise before or after services.**
- **Wear face coverings**
- **Use hand hygiene**
- **Keep distanced**

We have reluctantly taken the decision to suspend public worship in Everton whilst continuing at Gamlingay to allow people to attend church where they may receive Communion in one kind, in person. At the same time the service will be broadcast on Zoom.

Everton Church is open on Sundays only now for private prayer. The weekly worship material will be available to use in church if people wish to do so.

For the time being, under review, there continue to be communion services on Wednesdays and Sundays at Gamlingay at 9.30am. These services are also available live on Zoom.
