We have just marked a year since the first lockdown of this Pandemic, with all sorts of reflections around what has happened in between. Having mislaid the key to our Rectory noticeboard it still has last year's materials up, looking rather sad and damp - a reminder of how much hard work was done in haste and how little we could know about what was to come.

A year on we are better placed in many ways - the lock-out from churches is no longer in place, and we will be able to have our ancient buildings open and used, if not quite 'as usual', at least more visibly than last year. On Sunday we head into Holy Week, starting with Palm Sunday. This week will be the climax of our Christian religious observance, with Easter services available in all our churches.

Maundy Thursday Sedar Meal?

Sarah Titmus has Matzos bread (crackers) for any of us who would like some, and there is an option to meet together (on Zoom) to eat a meal remembering the Last Supper. No one, apart from Sarah, has expressed interest yet. Please let us know if you would like to join in. The idea would be to reflect on the Passover, the Jewish celebration with which Jesus' Last Supper is connected, and eat our own meals at home - traditionally this would be lamb. If there is interest I will circulate a list of things to get together for the remembrance and we could share recipes and even provide food for anyone who would like it. This would start at around 5.30pm to give time to get to church afterwards.

The Maundy Vigil.....

....marking the time of Jesus' arrest and trial, takes place following the Benefice Maundy Service at Gamlingay. As the service ends, the altar in Gamlingay will be stripped to stand bare over Good Friday. Altars will be stripped in the other churches following that.

Reserve Sacrament will be kept in Gamlingay and a vigil held until midnight.

Please sign up by sending me a message or giving me a ring if you would like to attend either Maundy or Good Friday communion, and for the vigil.

No one will be left on their own in church for the vigil at Gamlingay and the building will be locked at midnight.

Please indicate the time you intend to be present between 8.30pm and midnight.

If anyone would like to attend any of the other churches on that evening, please let me know. Blessings All for a Holy Easter.
