Maybe after this extended isolation villagers will be keener to get involved and re-ignite the social candle. Watch this space.

- Easter egg hunt and follow-up tea (in conjunction with the church).
- The re-introduction of guest speakers at the village hall.
- Possible music or food evenings.
- · Race nights.
- Film nights
- Theatrical events.
