From Hilary:

As May begins, we look forward to several key events in the life of our churches - we pray to stay 'on task' with only the things that fit with our mission and ministry as we seek to be salt and light in our communities.

- * We celebrate the birthday of the Church on 23rd May, the same day as we have the postponed Annual Parochial Church meeting in Everton, following the service there (see below for Pentecost services).
- * There is a confirmation service at the end of the month with +Dagmar Winter at Gamlingay. We await confirmation of what we are allowed to do. At the moment, our current risk assessments are still in place and we expect that physical distancing, face coverings and hand hygiene will still be required. Two of our candidates live in Gamlingay, one in Hatley.
- * We look to the prospect of returning to the previous service pattern while the review, moved forward from early last year, takes place on worship in the Benefice churches.

Heads Up for the change to marriage registration law

There has been change, which many will have missed, in the way church weddings are registered. This was voted in under the government led by David Cameron and finally became law some months ago but has only recently come into force - from Tuesday this week in fact (4th May).

The 'old' marriage registers are no longer in use and will not be in the future. They are being formally closed and will be returned to County Offices. From 4th May ministers can no longer issue marriage certificates for weddings that have taken place in the church for which they are responsible.

I will still be able to conduct weddings in the churches of the Benefice and Banns can still be a legal means to a wedding in a local church, but there are some changes.

All marriages will be registered on a document produced by the Registry Office, filled in electronically, printed off and signed. The document will be completed by the officiating minister with the couple before the wedding, to be signed on the day and then returned to the Registry by the minister. This new form of registration allows for up to six witnesses, and for up to four 'parents' to be recorded. New rules about who these can be, will be discussed with couples at time of arranging the wedding - they give the opportunity to include mothers and step-parents, where the old forms only recorded birth fathers of bride and groom, if names were supplied.
