I am sure I am not the only one who is finding this time of transition, and further uncertainty mixed with hope, tiring. Well done all for what we are achieving and thank you for keeping going.


This Sunday and next Sunday are both festivals - Pentecost and Trinity Sunday following on from the festival of Ascension which we celebrated on Thursday 13th May and Sunday 16th May. During the intervening 10 days between Ascension and Pentecost, the Church has been praying fervently 'Come Holy Spirit' as we prepare to celebrate that enigma of our faith, God who is Three in One known to us in three ways: Creator, Redeemer (Saviour), and Power-giver (Enabler). Everton APCM follows the 4pm service this week.

These two Sundays give us an opportunity to think about who we are as the Body of Christ.

What does our faith mean and how do we express it?

What sort of followers of Christ are we? Are we Christmas, Good Friday, Easter, Pentecost or Trinity people? Or are we able to hold all these together, sometimes in tension, and be Jesus Christ people?

In each generation we have Movements within the Church. The Church experiences the ebbing and flowing of life, death and rebirth which is associated with all living things. Charismatics revive our acceptance of the Holy Spirit at work, Evangelicals emphasise the Word, personified in Jesus and expressed in the Bible. We seem to find it difficult to grasp the enormity of who and what we are, and history is littered with the churches losing their way by focusing on one aspect of the truth to the exclusion of all else. A senior churchman once said in my hearing 'whenever I doubt that there is a God I look at the church and know that there must be, for such an organisation to have survived this long'. For despite our human failings, which are sometimes writ large in the church, God is faithful, and continues to be at work, creating and recreating, so that the Church survives despite her failure to be all that we continue to hope for as we pray 'Your/Thy Kingdom Come!' So Happy Birthday, and Many Happy Returns to the Church of God.



### **Everton and Hatley Churchyards**

The open churchyards in these two churches in use in our parishes and the redundant church in East Hatley all have wild flowers worth a look. In Everton the saxifrage is coming into bloom, and the new burial ground beyond the churchyard has hawthorn in blossom and an extensive patch of cowslips among much else.

Hatley St George has some lady's smock in a patch protected from mowing near the road, and cowslips in the unmanaged area at the back.
