St Mary's Children's Society Collection Boxes

This year we raised the sum of £138.58 for the Children's Society and thanks to all the box holders who helped provide some much-needed funds .

I am always looking for more people to hold a box so thought it might be an idea to give you some information about the vital work the society undertakes...

The Children's Society was founded in the late nineteenth century by **Edward Rudolf**, a Sunday School teacher and civil servant in South London. Rudolf led a deputation to Archibald Tait, Archbishop of Canterbury to put forward a plan for the establishment of Church of England children's homes as an alternative to the large workhouses and orphanages common at that time. The society now provides specialist support that empowers young people to make positive changes and rediscover their hope by working alongside young people, their families, and the community. Young people turn to the children's society when they have low self-esteem; when they're living in families who can't afford the next meal, the next size up in school uniform, or when there's no one else to lean on. Refugee and migrant children land in this country alone and look to them for guidance to achieve the life they dreamed of. To have a settled home, a secure job and starting a family

Children's Society counsellors meet with teenagers who want to quit using drugs or alcohol and who may be looking after mum, dad, or their siblings, or who have been taken advantage of and find themselves carrying drugs to far away towns or having sex with strangers.

It is vital the Children's Society receives financial support to continue their work so, please, if you are able to help them by having a donation box in your home that would be wonderful. All it involves is putting some loose change in when you can, and I will collect it once a year

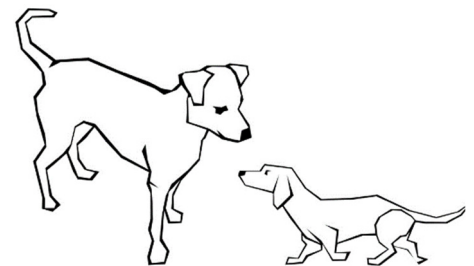
Bring with you to Hatley on Sunday afternoon - as early as possible.

We have received a letter from Christian Aid thanking us, as a Benefice, for our “generous gift of £1,460.00”. The letter goes on to say :



“With your gift this Christian Aid Week you are supporting communities to access a reliable source of water, helping to provide a stable income and keep families healthy.”

An example is given of a woman called Florence living in Kitui, Kenya. A few years ago she was struggling to cope. She had no water to grow crops, her children were hungry and she had to walk for hours on a dangerous journey to collect water. Now, with support from Christian Aid in partnership with Anglican Development Services Eastern, Florence has her own dam and water supply. She says :

“My life has changed. I am very happy. You can see it in my face: my face is shining. I have strength and power”.

Florence’s family is just one of many benefitting from projects to build better earth dams and harvest more water, sow drought-tolerant crops and to demand that governments prioritise climate justice.

Let us never forget how lucky we are not to have to worry about such things and continue to support the ongoing work of Christian Aid in areas of the world where it is so badly needed.
