From Hilary

A good deal of communication and planning is going on to enable work to start on Gamlingay church building on Monday (November 15th) as was reported 'hot off the press' last week. At the time of writing the exact arrangements for the services that had been planned through to early January are still being finalised but we are likely to be having a 'mixed economy' - using the other church buildings of the Benefice, with possible supplementary use of the Kingspan room in the EcoHub. This inevitably pushes those who habitually worship at St Mary's in Gamlingay out of their comfort-zone but, as with most challenging situations, there is opportunity for growth:

- We have the opportunity to give to and receive hospitality from our brothers and sisters in Christ 'pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too'.
- We can appreciate the place in which we are most comfortable all the more for being away for a while, particularly as it will be more comfortable when we get back to it.
- This helps us all to realise afresh that 'we are the body of Christ'. The church is fundamentally 'people' not 'place' - important though places are because of what they mean to people and what they enable people to do.

Remembrance Sunday 14th November - services as advertised

Gamlingay Christmas Fair

Among much that has needed re-planning, the Christmas Fair that would have been in the church at Gamlingay on Saturday 11th and Sunday 12th December cannot take place as previously. The tickets for the draw are already printed and the draw is licensed for the 12th, watch out for when and how that will now take place - it could well be after the Sunday morning service.

The Fair itself is being planned for the EcoHub on the Saturday, but there is a great deal to do in a short time if this is to be the financial success it needs to be. Gamlingay and Hatley finances depend very much on fund-raising and this event has historically been a very important part of that. If you can help in any way and are not already 'in the loop' please let Hilary know. Watch out for ways to contribute, and let's make this a good event.

Advent

This Advent we will be thinking about Angels, linked to the four weekly themes of Patriarchs, Prophets, John the Baptist and Mary. As well as the study sessions, which will look at some occasions where angels feature in the Bible, there is opportunity for creativity - angel windows around the village.

Advent begins in November this year, Advent Sunday being on the 28th. The planned Authorisation service celebrating our lay ministers will have to be different, but the plan is to authorise our new ALM Children's Work (Sarah Titmus) at Hatley that Sunday in the morning, with an Advent Carols service at Everton in the afternoon.
