From Hilary...

Annual Parochial Church Meetings (APCMs)

These have been previously announced and are planned for each of our parishes on Sunday 27th February. This is earlier than some churches have them in an attempt to make them as relevant as possible - the reporting is on the year ending December of the previous year (2021 in this case). If we have the meetings as late as permitted (end of April) a third of the year has gone, and it is a bit late to be making new plans

for the coming year. It is also a bit far back to remember what happened in the previous year.

So, a huge THANK YOU to those who have worked to put the reports together. Dawn, in Gamlingay, has had a particularly big task, as collating the information from various sources to provide the report is no small undertaking. A special 'thank you' to the people who have been involved with the financial reporting process. Our external examiner Colin Airey has been particularly helpful, with Ian Parker, in enabling timings for earlier meetings to be met.

The reports themselves are required from us by law. Each PCC is a charity in its own right and comes under the umbrella of the Church of England, a Charity exempt from registration. As such, we must produce a report on the finances and associated activities. Certain elements are prescribed by the Church of England (such as the report on the electoral roll) but for the last few years the reports have been expected to be much more closely aligned with other charity reporting requirements than with our traditional ones.

As Dawn wrote last week, this is an opportunity to celebrate what has been achieved in the previous year, look at where we can see God at work among us then and now, and to look forward to what will happen and needs to be done in the coming year. Do please make the effort to be there and be part of the story of our churches. The report, as presented, is owned by the whole PCC of each parish and is intended to relate the financial picture to the programme of activities. It should give a comprehensive picture of the church's year to people who do not know the parish, as well as to those who do.

APCM in Gamlingay - why evening, and after an evening service?

The PCC collectively decided, after some reflection, to go for this time and day. The assumption made by Hilary was that the meeting should take place after some act of worship. However, this doesn't have to be the case if that's a problem though, if it is, the question is why?.

The option to follow a morning service, as in some previous years, was not available since we are not in St Mary's for worship so cannot meet there or easily move to the Church Hall from either of the churches we are using. The PCC thought we should stick to Sunday rather than a weekday. The plan is to share refreshments (cheese and wine is planned, with other nibbles and soft drinks included) to make this a social as well as a business occasion. It would be helpful therefore to know rough numbers.

I shall be writing to everyone on the Electoral Rolls of each church before the meetings, and the reports will be available from this Sunday. To save paper we will be only printing the copies we need to, please let Dawn or Hilary know if you need a paper copy.

The Queen's Diamond Jubilee

St. Mary's Church Gamlingay - Project Update (From Alec Hissett)


Last Thursday, 9th February, several members of the Project Group met with the architect, quantity surveyor and representatives of CEL Group Ltd. (our main contractor) for the monthly progress meeting. The work on the nave roof is now complete and work is due to start on the south transept roof repairs this week. Some of the capping stones on the north parapet and north porch were found to be loose and have been removed. These will be reinstated as part of the current work.

Four windows have been removed and sent off to be re-leaded. Repairs to the surrounding stonework have been specified and a quotation for the work will be provided this week. Again, this work was anticipated and is budgeted as part of the Project.

No major problems have been experienced, although overnight frosts have caused some minor delays. The bulk of the work (80% of total cost) will be complete by the end of March. It is hoped that we will be back in church soon after Easter.
