Annual Parochial Church Meetings (APCMs)

Thank you to everyone who attended our meetings on Sunday, especially those who contributed to refreshments, most welcome in both cases.

A great debt of gratitude goes to those who worked so hard and contributed so much to all that last year's reports contained. Church Wardens, Jane, Chris and Nick, all have work of which they can be proud and for which we are very grateful. That same gratitude continues for those taking up again, or carrying on with, responsibility for decisions (and carrying them out) for our churches. For various reasons we are without Church Wardens this year, their responsibilities being shared among the PCC and Parish Priest. Your love, prayers and support for us all will be very much needed to make this work (we are told we are not alone in the Diocese in being in this situation). We have been and will continue to be negotiating increasingly challenging administrative requirements, particularly in the areas of safeguarding. It is right that we should not only keep one another safe, but also make sure that we are accountable in doing that. Please be patient if this means signing something, doing some more training, or receiving a job description for something you have been doing for years. And - thank you for what you each contribute to supporting our common life as the People of God, through Jesus Christ the Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Our new PCCs have the task of setting priorities for our parishes for this year, as economics change again for the worse when they were already going to be tougher and we have moral and statutory Safeguarding requirements to meet. I quote here a piece of wisdom shared in the resurrection of the Scargill Community after closure:

'Without the business, we have not mission,

Without the mission, we have not business to be here'

Both mission and business are required, each for the other to thrive. We trust God for his provision and continue to ask and be thankful when it comes. We cannot afford not to work in both fields so please don't snipe at one another (or me!) if you find your calling doesn't match someone else's or you feel the emphasis isn't right - it won't be all the time but be aware you may not have the whole picture when you think things should be done differently. Do ask and listen to the answers as to what is going on. As the Methodist covenant says, if not in so many words, 'in some things I may please myself and God, in others I can only please God'. But let's not get that the wrong way up, God is not pleased by our being miserable! Let us find joy in our duty, and in our joy find our duty.

As churches we will be looking at everything we do (and don't do) as we take stock after two years of pandemic and, who knows, maybe on the brink of WW3. We look in the light of our calling to be the 'good' (salt and light in biblical imagery) in all the places our lives touch - from our homes to the whole wide world. We do this in the context of an increasingly fractured and destabilised society. My prayer is that we can do this together as the Body of Christ - let us not be tempted into fractious blaming of one another for what is not possible or demanding of others what we are unable to provide ourselves. The world is falling apart, let's not break the church!

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee

There are village celebrations planned in Gamlingay and Hatley during the weekend in June designated for the Jubilee. The Saturday is very much taken up, but the churches have the Sunday when the Pentecost (Whitsunday) celebrations will have the added dimension of celebrating the Queen's long reign as head of the Anglican Church.

In Hatley a village party is being advertised.

In Gamlingay representatives from various groups, including the two churches in the village, attended a meeting where what is being planned in the village was shared.

There will be a publication coordinated by a small group and contributed to by all, including St Mary's in Gamlingay. This is designed to support the celebrations, raise the profile of various organisations contributing and provide a keepsake, particular to the village, from the occasion. At St Mary's the main project for the Jubilee, which is hoped to have a legacy well beyond the day, is the eco-project in the churchyard and church hall garden. This will be led, together with the PCC, by Jenny Shelton and her husband Kevin. A party on the afternoon of the Saturday in the church hall and garden will celebrate and inform about the project. It will be one of many around the village and there may be a map to show people who wish to 'do the rounds' where to look. There may well also be an exhibition in church covering the 7 decades of the Queen's reign, invitations are in preparation for contributions from the History Society and the Photographic Society.

There is no news, as yet, from Everton but plans will be shared here in due course.
