New Service Patterns

It seems highly unlikely (to say the least!) that a survey will have been agreed, distributed and results returned before the beginning of June as we had hoped. After Pentecost and the Jubilee services Ordinary time starts, taking us through the Summer, and that had been the revised target for a new pattern to begin. However various reasons, including health issues in our parishes and the Deanery planning group, have resulted in slower-than-hoped-for progress. This does **not** mean that the process has stopped or will not produce a result, but it **does** mean that we don't have the new pattern in place for June as had been intended. That introduction has now been put back yet again - possibly to the Autumn. To help everyone who contributes to services I am, therefore, producing the following plan for all Sundays in June, and this may extend through July - basically the same services every Sunday with the possibility of an early service at Hatley or an Evensong.

How much do you know about dementia and how we might help those living with it in 2022? We will be joined at the EcoHub on Tuesday, 7th June at 1.30pm by Jan Payne, a Dementia Friends Ambassador for the Alzheimer's Society and Project Leader for the new Dementia Friendly Community in Histon and Impington. Jan will give a Dementia Friends presentation and say a little more about the role that a community can play in helping those with dementia (and their Carers) live as well as they can. Project Update - from Alec Hissett

There was another site meeting last Friday (13th May). Much progress has been made but there are a few items of work to complete:

- The stone required to rebuild the mullion in the north-west window (children's corner) has been delivered and should now be ready for the glass to be installed. We hope that Lincolnshire Stained Glass will be available to do this in the next couple of weeks.
- Work on the south aisle parapets is almost complete and the scaffolding on the south side will be removed this week.
- Lead on the north transept ridge is being replaced and will, by now, be complete.
- One of the north aisle gates has been removed as the hinge mounting failed. This work has been specified and is awaiting new stone and replacement ironwork, which is being produced by Chris Smith.

It is hoped that all work, except the gate, will be complete by mid-June.
