Last Week

Welcome to the church family to Freddie Paul Ron Andrews baptised at Hatley St George on Sunday and congratulations to Joe and Emma Drybrough on their marriage on Saturday.

Everton church will have seen three lovely local weddings this year (although Joe and Emma live in York, Emma's Mum and Dad are longstanding Everton people) so there will be much to give thanks for in October as part of the Benefice celebrations.

The PCC met on Monday. For various reasons numbers were well down but thank you to Eileen for taking the notes - more details next time. A key item discussed was church finance. Gamlingay and Hatley Parish needs to find something like £2,000 per month for the rest of the year over and above what is currently forecast. This is without the expected hike in fuel bills after October when these come up for review. Although we have some good plans for fund-raising, more will definitely be needed. I look forward to ideas for how we might meet this challenge - it is a Benefice concern if either of our churches is struggling financially. Gamlingay PCC has Hatley St George Church to maintain (insurance and electricity bills) as well as St Mary the Virgin building that has been closed for repairs for six months, so this was always going to be a tough year.

At Gamlingay the main building project is now complete and finance details will be available shortly. There is an outstanding 'extra' due to be completed during the next weeks involving the South Porch gates. After the pins are in place the stonework will have to 'cure' before the gates can be hung.

Well done to everyone who cleaned the church last Friday. As from 1st July the building will, once again, be open during the day and a new rota for unlocking and locking will be in place.

NEWS FROM EVERTON

We are delighted to say that St Mary's Everton-cum-Tetworth Church clock will be returning home after receiving extensive refurbishment. Cumbria Clock Company have worked to repair the mechanism and install a new automatic winding

System. This work will give the church its voice back allowing the clock to strike the hour as originally designed. The work to reinstall the clock will last for a full five days starting on Monday 27th of June.

There will be Church restrictions for Health and Safety reasons while the rope work and fine-tuning are completed.

Please note that the church will be locked while the tower work is completed and there will be a restricted area outside at the base of the tower.

We look forward to our first service on Sunday 3rd of July with a fully functioning clock and strike.

NEWS FROM EAST HATLEY

St Denis' East Hatley open every day.....

St Denis' church in East Hatley is now open every day from around 8.30 am to dusk to look round or for quiet contemplation, *writes Peter Mann*.

This is the first time St Denis' has been open on a regular basis since it was closed for worship in 1959 – when, aided by destructive vandals, it was effectively left to rot. By 2003 it was covered in ivy and in a perilous state on the verge of collapse. Local pressure on SCDC, which owned the building at the time, kick-started the first of many restoration projects, first as a 'safe shell', albeit without windows or a floor – although thanks to Ian Parker's efforts, it was (just) capable of holding Taizé services in 2011 and 2014.

After the Friends of Friendless Churches took ownership of the church (only the building, not the churchyard, which remains consecrated – you can still be buried here) in late 2016, a succession of restoration projects put in floor and windows. This spring, a lot of the crumbling plaster in the nave was removed and replaced with a traditional lime putty mortar, sealed with a lime wash coating specially coloured to match William Butterfield's restoration of 1874.

So next time you're heading out on the road to Croydon hill, passing first though Hatley St George (the key to the church is in the farmhouse opposite) and then the village hall (now with new toilets!), turn right into East Hatley's 'main street' and just after the last of the houses on the right, look for the fingerpost to St Denis', walk down the short footpath and there you will find, proud and handsome, East Hatley's only mediaeval building. And when you go in, think not so much of 2022, but how someone from 1322 might not feel too much of a stranger.
