Hatley St George Church

The church is due for a Quinquennial inspection, however the way the Diocese supports this process has changed. Whereas in the past the Diocese paid the architects directly and specified who might do the inspection, now a fixed sum is paid to the parish when the inspection takes place and the PCC chooses and pays the architect. As the fixed sum does not cover the full cost of an inspection, this will need to be looked into. Thank you to Micky Astor for supporting discussions to take this forward.

The work planned for the trees in the churchyard at Hatley has been resurrected after falling foul of Covid. The plan is to trim the yew trees to allow more light through. Plans were submitted but seem to have got lost and we now await a response from the DAC advisers.
