#### **Twelve days of Christmas**

The celebration for Christmas itself (rather than the anticipation of it) begins on Sunday (Christmas Day) starting with the midnight service at 11.30pm on Saturday in Gamlingay.

Christmas Day services are as advertised. The season ends for western Christians at Epiphany, when the Orthodox Church starts its Christmas celebrations and we continue to Candlemas celebrating the Light of the World, born in human form at Christmas.

There are meditations for each of the days between Christmas and Epiphany 'Follow the Star' (app available) offering reflections for each day from Christmas to Epiphany.

These are available online; I will collect them for anyone who lets me know they would like.

This year we celebrate Epiphany in church on 8th January with services in both the parish churches.

#### How wise were the wise men?

The Magi followed the star to the land of the Jews it led to, but when they got there they resorted to their own wisdom as to where to look, and went to the King's palace - the obvious place to find a new-born king. But in so



doing they risk jeopardising the whole point of their search. Herod, the self-styled King, is afraid for his power, and once alerted to the presence of another King, is hell-bent on destruction. The wise men return to following the star, to find the king in an unexpected place.

So what does that mean for us? We are called, like those first Magi, to follow the Christ light, to find God in unexpected places, turning worldly values on their head, and trusting not in our own wisdom, but in what God has set us to.

#### **Update from Niassa**

As many of you will know St Mary's and the folk in Gamlingay have been supporting our brothers and sisters in Niassa in Mozambique for many years . Fr Mateus Nkito has sent this update to Chris Martin this week:

Greetings to all church members there, Brother Chris.

Currently the church in Niassa is getting a little balanced and we hope with the prayer, that the new diocesan leadership will be organized and united.

The situation of terrorism in Mozambique, particularly in the northern region, is; A great threat, and their attacks are unpredictable. Although we do not have frequent attacks on Niassa, fear in communities is greater.

We have an accommodation center of the victims of terrorism in Lichinga, which is in the capital of Niassa.

### **Twelve days of Christmas**

There is an interpretation of the well-known song that sees in it encoded Christian (Catholic) teaching. Although this is probably not original and in some cases takes a bit of struggling to fit, Christians can still use the idea to reflect on faith. Maybe you can think of better versions than the one here?

A partridge in a pear tree Christ the son of God - partridges being understood as willing to sacrifice themselves for their young as Christ died for us all.

**Two turtle doves** - the two main parts for the Bible - Old and New Testaments that tell the story of God's work to reconcile creation back to the Master

**Three French hens** - faith hope and love (three of our Advent week themes this year) as elaborated in 1 Corinthians 13 by St Paul. - or the persons of the Trinity, Father Son and Holy Spirit.

Four Calling Birds - the Gospel writers (Evangelists) Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

**Five gold rings** - the five books of our Old Testament which make up the Pentateuch - the Torah (Law) that Jesus refers to when he speaks of 'the Law and the Prophets'

Six geese a-laying - the six days of creation when everything was formed (hatched) by God.

**Seven swans a-swimming** - the seven gifts of the Spirit prophecy, ministry, teaching, exhortation, giving, leading, and compassion as identified by St Paul.

**Eight maids a-milking** - the hard and menial and female work of milking symbolising God's care for all people, turning worldly values on their heads in the Beatitudes - blessed are the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, and those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake.

Nine ladies dancing - the fruits of the Spirit - love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness,

gentleness, and self-control bringing life in its fulness expressed in the dance.

Ten Lords a-leaping - Lords as judges the ten commandments



**Eleven pipers piping** - the number of the disciples when Judas was lost to them, as they began to tell the Good news of who Jesus was.

**Twelve Drummers Drumming** - twelve elements of the Apostle's Creed

I believe in -

God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord

Conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit born of the Virgin Mary. Suffered under Pontius Pilate, crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell.

On the third day, he rose again.

He ascended into heaven seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. Holy Spirit (*lord and giver of life*),

Holy catholic Church (the company of Christ in time and eternity - not a denomination)

Communion of saints, (the saved are a community through their partaking of the sacrament of Holy Communion) The forgiveness of sins, (Jesus reconciles humanity through his death, he has the power to set free humanity from the power of sin and death)

The resurrection of the body, life everlasting (in Christ's resurrection a new body is given that is not of this world of time and space and not subject to decay)
