Our thoughts and prayers are with those who could not be there, for good reasons (to do with health and family commitments). Thank you to those who did make it. It was a great pleasure to welcome Richard Harlow, who follows Hugh McCurdy in the role of Archdeacon of Huntingdon and Wisbech and his wife Kayla. Richard spoke to us of the 'hedgehog principle', about identifying what you are good at and keeping doing it to the best of your ability. He also reminded us all that what the Church is there for is to spread God's love and thereby make life better for all around.

**Epiphany Season continues** as we celebrate further aspects of how Jesus was shown to be the Light of the World for all nations. This Sunday is again about calling, as we have Matthew's version of the calling of Simon (Peter) and Andrew and the brothers James and John. Next Sunday we return to the earlier story of Simeon and Anna recognising the infant Messiah in the temple as we end Epiphany and our thoughts turn towards Lent and Easter.

Every year. at this time, some of the churches have a week of prayer for Christian Unity. It began on Wednesday, which happens to be our midweek communion in Gamlingay.

#### Living in Love and Faith

The following press release comes from the Church of England after six years of reflection. Online comments have already confirmed Archbishop Justin Welby's prediction that for some this is not enough and for others it is much too much.....

'For the first time, under historic plans outlined today (Friday 20th January), same-sex couples will be able to come to church to give thanks for their civil marriage or civil partnership and receive God's blessing.

- Living in Love and Faith was initiated in 2017 after Synod rejected a report from the bishops offering no change. Responding to that vote the Archbishops of Canterbury and York called for a "radical new Christian inclusion founded in scripture, in reason, in tradition, in theology and the Christian faith as the Church of England has received it based on good, healthy, flourishing relationships, and in a proper 21st century understanding of being human and of being sexual."
