I'm much improved but my apologies if the fact that I am still somewhat under the weather with a suspected non-Covid virus affects what I can do at the moment.

Palm crosses from Gamlingay were duly collected and incinerated - as anyone visiting our house for days after will smell! I didn't manage to do them outside and the kitchen extractor fan wasn't up to the task. Palm crosses do not burn easily and make a lot of smoke even after being a year old and then oven-dried for hours!

Of course, ashes are a very visible external symbol of the penitence that is one of the themes of Lent, but penitence is not about feeling miserable and guilty, nor about making a show of what we are doing. Penitence does require recognition and acknowledgement of guilt, but that's not 'it' - moving on is the key. The theme of Lent is actually about being <u>freed</u> from guilt, not wallowing in it, whether we are doing that deliberately or not.

Notice Of Revision Of Church Electoral Roll For The Parish Of Gamlingay With Hatley St. George And East Hatley

The Electoral Roll will be revised by the Parochial Church Council over the next few weeks and ending on the **27**th **day of March 2023.** After the revision, a copy of the Roll will be published by the Parochial Church Council on the church notice boards for at least 14 days before the Annual Meeting on 23 April 2023.

If you wish to have your name added to or removed from the Roll or if you have any changes in the details held on the roll, please contact the Church Electoral Roll Officer (Valerie Miller).

Under the Church Representation Rules, a lay person is entitled to have his or her name entered on the roll if the person –

- (a) is baptised,
- (b) is aged 16 or over, and
- (c) has made one of the following three declarations and duly applied for enrolment.

The first declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it and is resident in the parish.

The second declaration is that the person is a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, is not resident in the parish, but has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.

The third declaration is that the person is a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and has habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.

Application Forms for enrolment can be obtained from the Church Electoral Roll Officer (Valerie Miller). In order for a person to be entitled to attend the annual parochial church meeting and to take part in its proceedings, an Application Form for enrolment must be returned by 27 March 2023.

A list of current members of the Electoral Roll is displayed in St. Mary the Virgin Church porch and on the notice board of the church at Hatley St George. Any error discovered in the Roll should at once be reported to the Church Electoral Roll Officer.

This Newsletter is circulated by email each week to all on the Church Electoral Roll plus anyone else who gives their email details and requests it. It contains any news we have been given to share in our villages (Everton, Gamlingay and the Hatleys) plus news of what's going on in all three churches in the two parishes of the Benefice. Gamlingay with the Hatleys is one parish while Everton and Tetworth is the second linked parish in the current Benefice - both looked after by one parish priest.
