From Hilary...

Blessings for this first week of Easter.

Although this is called 'low week' in some church circles, because we've been on such a high at Easter and it is traditionally the time clergy take off (which I am doing), there are important items to include this week so here they are in brief, with a big THANK YOU to people helping to make things happen.

Gamlingay APCM is nearly upon us. If you are on the Electoral Roll, please think about whether you could serve, or support someone else to do so, on the PCC in furthering the mission and ministry in this parish (which includes the Hatleys) as part of a Benefice. Governance is an essential part of the Church of England, and increasingly needs committed lay participation to make it work in partnership with the Parish Priest. We are very blessed that Nick Ingles is willing to continue as Treasurer in Gamlingay and Richard in Everton - probably the most burdensome of the many tasks needed to keep the church running. We have had a year without Churchwardens, and this takes its toll not only on the running of the church but personally on the ordained ministry it is meant to support and work with. The PCCs have worked hard to fill the gap, but it would help hugely to have named people to coordinate this effort.

Finances: Thank you SO much to those who responded to Nick and myself with offers of financial help or additional money in the church plates. It is not too late to do so, and more is needed if you meant to and did not, but what we've already received is a GREAT help. We will publish outcomes next time, but a special thank you to the person who got in touch with a generous one-off donation as well as an increase in monthly giving, reaching me via Nick in time for Easter Day itself - better than any chocolate Easter egg, and something that will make a lasting difference.

Easter: I hope others shared my experience of Easter this year in that it was most uplifting to be part of, although very tiring with the shortage of personnel due to illness and other commitments, and a very late session at the Cathedral on the Saturday evening.

WELCOME to Ann and Jess, already with us regularly, confirmed on Holy Saturday, and to Linda who was baptised on Easter Sunday at Gamlingay.

A HUGE thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make all the churches beautiful and suitable for the season. They were all lovely, and I know took time and effort to produce. Flower arrangers - you know who you are - THANK YOU.

To help for future years (as we had some last-minute adjustments that not everyone was aware of) here are the key elements of Holy Week and Easter decoration in churches - depending on the tradition of each worshipping congregation. Usually included are:

- Lent tradition of no flowers maintained until Holy Saturday in preparation for Sunday.

Exception to this - on Maundy Thursday, a 'Garden of Repose' where the reserved sacrament used on Good Friday is placed until used. In some churches the Garden of Repose is an extraordinarily elaborate affair (check out the internet for competitive entries to the 'biggest and best'!).

It remains until after the sacrament is consumed and then either removed or adjusted for Easter Day. Special thanks to Chris and Eileen who did such a nice job for Anne who has done it beautifully in previous years at Gamlingay - I think this tradition may be new to the Benefice in my time?

- A cross, hung with a purple drape from Good Friday, changed to a white drape on Easter Day, to which flowers are also added.

- Some representation of the tomb and garden - sometimes put in on Friday with no flowers which are then (and maybe eggs!) added on Saturday, with representation of the tomb, open and empty on Sunday morning. We had three very different versions this year. Thank you and well done to Sarah in Hatley, the Endersby family in Everton and Ann (newly confirmed) in Gamlingay who helped me to make up for the usual contributors running out of time. For Easter Day - the Easter (Paschal) Candle is placed centrally, its stand decorated with flowers - Roderick has done this beautifully for Gamlingay every year in my time, Beverley and her friend Maggie helped me do this in Everton, we don't have a stand in Hatley (?yet).

- And of course, the whole church filled with flowers on Easter Day, with a 'sneak peek' at the Easter Vigil service on Holy Saturday if there is one (we were at the cathedral this year).
