From Hilary...

Last week was extremely busy and, in some respects, emotional for me on a personal level as well as in parish life with a funeral and Gamlingay APCM. Alongside the parish work a trip 'up north' was fitted in for my last meeting as a trustee of the Scargill Movement, whose work revolves around the Christian community at Scargill House in Kettlewell (N Yorkshire limestone dales). As Covid, distance and family health have prevented visits over the last two (nearly three) years it has been sad to finish, but the time was right. Some of us who have been there from the rebirth/resurrection of this Christian Holiday and Conference Centre with a residential community at its heart, are stepping aside to let new people take on the Trustee roles with, hopefully, the right overlaps and hand-overs to ensure the continuing flourishing of the mission of this special place where God is so obviously and actively present. As a Vice President I will continue in an advocacy role. There are booklets with the programme for this coming year in both churches. Do chat with me if this is of interest, in particular there is room for community members who take up residence for anything from a few weeks in Summer to several years. There are roles to suit all skills, and training is given for the right people, so it is a place to learn new things - administration, estate management, catering, hospitality, chaplaincy. The main requirement is willingness to commit to a Christian Community - Lives Shared, Lives Transformed, which includes prayer, hard work, laughter and tears in the service of God and God's people.

New PCCs: Welcome and an enormous 'thank you' to everyone who has been willing to take on responsibilities in church governance for this next year. Although Everton APCM has already taken place, both PCCs are now appointed and so this feels like the start of the year, as people will be getting to know one another across the Benefice.

'Thank you' also goes to outgoing PCC members who, for various good reasons, will not be continuing. Their expertise and support will continue to be valuable and valued. Both parishes will be thinking about how, within the structures we inherit, we can operate effectively as church and society evolve, and the opportunities for committing time and energy to church activities decrease. We have work to do to enable us to function in mission and ministry, proclaiming and living out the Good News of the Kingdom of God as we can, not being stopped by what we cannot.

June Flower Festival(s): The Gamlingay Events Group met on Tuesday this week, and put some work into details for this event, with which the Gamlingay Summer Fair is planned to coincide. The idea of a Flower Festival (not all the exhibits have to be flowers!) was first floated some time ago as part of the Events Group's planning, to raise the profile of the church as well as to raise funds. The hope and intention was, and is, for this to reach beyond our local community and to be a Benefice-wide event. Everton PCC agreed, and the planning has been progressed. Gamlingay parish includes Hatley St George Church, and that will be represented in the Gamlingay display. As this will absorb the resources of Hatley as a small community. Hilary is offering to decorate Hatley church following the same theme of 'Tell me a story'. Christians are holders of 'The greatest story ever told' and the little church at Hatley St George will be a wonderful setting to elaborate that story.
