### From Hilary...

'Thy Kingdom Come' season is upon us - a worldwide initiative between Ascension and Pentecost. For some it is an opportunity to pray with renewed intensity that phrase from the Lord's Prayer 'Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven' - perhaps with some named individuals in mind. Maybe for others it might be a time to think why this doesn't appeal or feel helpful - maybe we don't think our prayers make a difference. When I feel that way, I remember that (to quote something of which I now can't find the origin) we pray not that God might be informed, but that we might be conformed, which brings me to the fact that I've missed two significant church calendar items.....

**Rogation** is a season kept particularly in rural areas. It is traditionally a time to 'beat the bounds' of the parish, identifying the boundaries, but it is also a season to pray for the seed time and in general for the growing of what will become the harvest of the natural world. So as we pray 'Thy Kingdom Come', we can pray for good seed to sow and the opportunity to sow it in both a physical and spiritual sense (and yes, I know, the crops in our fields have been sown months ago in many cases!).

**St. Matthias** - The other 'miss' is less obvious, but our Anglican lectionary places the day we remember St Matthias as 14th May, this year moved to 15th May so as not to be on a Sunday and displace Easter lectionary. Matthias is one of those many, mainly unnamed, disciples who followed Jesus throughout his life, death, and resurrection. We know about him, and another called Justus, because they were the two who were thought to be good enough replacements for Judas Iscariot. Matthias is chosen by casting lots after prayer. Not much is known about him and there are different stories as to his ministry and death, but when I remember him, I also remember Justus and thank God for the chosen and their ministry, but also those who don't quite make it into the 'top set' but still live godly lives of service.

**Scythe skills** - we are in the early stages of exploring the possibility of having a community scything team (trained by a specialist) which would be involved in conservation mowing in churchyards and public spaces in our area. Let Hilary or Alec know if you are interested.
