From Hilary:

Well done and thank you to everyone who made Mothering Sunday a significant celebration this year, with posies in both churches being very much appreciated - thank you to the makers and distributors.

This weekend, the 5th Sunday of Lent, sees the start of Passiontide as the final build-up to Easter begins heading towards next Sunday's Palm Sunday services at the start of Holy Week. This week the Gospel is the story of Jesus being anointed at Bethany – click here for a copy of the children's activity sheet.

Both services next week on Palm Sunday are shared across the Benefice. As many as are able are encouraged to share cars and join in both the Liturgy of the Palms at Everton - a short celebratory service during which palm crosses are blessed and distributed remembering Jesus' final triumphal entry to Jerusalem - and then, after a journey between the churches, the Liturgy of the Passion which follows at Gamlingay. At this service Luke's passion account is read as part of the Communion service. For those for whom attending both services is not appropriate, there is quiet time at Gamlingay before palm crosses are brought in from the earlier Everton service and distributed. The Liturgy of the Passion that follows will again include a dramatic presentation of Luke's telling of Jesus' last time, with different voices recounting the Gospel narrative, and even some whole congregation participation. LENT STUDY

The Lent Hope thoughts this week have been about Noticing; this upcoming last week of Lent takes Courage as it's hope theme.

Advance Benefice News - Rogation season

Rogation days fall in the May half term holiday week, which also includes Ascension Day. There are plans developing for Rogation walks on both weekends either side of the actual dates of 26th - 29th May. There will be more information and sign-up opportunities as plans develop, but it's not too early to express interest and offer help.

On 24th May there is a proposal for a walk from Gamlingay church to Everton church with refreshments at the end and time spent in each church. Walkers can then either return on foot or lifts will be arranged. Hilary is the contact for this one.
