ROGATION

The Wednesday midweek service this week also followed a Rogation theme, as it fell on one of the two actual designated days.

The week will be rounded off in the Hatleys on **Saturday 31st May** with a community led 'Beating the Bounds' walk which will include a picnic and short Rogation prayers at lunch time at Haley Wood.

Ascension: This will have been marked on the day by services outside the Benefice. Ann and Hilary were the only ones signed up for a trip to Ely. This marks the beginning of 'Thy Kingdom Come' season prayers from Thursday to Pentecost Sunday. Online material can be found at https://www.thykingdomcome.global which has downloadable resources to support prayer during this season.

This coming Sunday, the one after Ascension (Easter 7), will remember the festival in our parish churches as we prepare for the celebration of Pentecost next Sunday, which completes the church festival season and leads into a summer of Ordinary (ordered) time before Thanksgiving and Remembrance season begins in the Autumn to round off the year.

Pentecost/Whitsun 8th June, marking the gifting of the Holy Spirit, will be celebrated in all our churches in some way. The Parish churches will have their usual Parish Eucharists, possibly with birthday cake afterwards; a reflective time at Hatley St George church is in the calendar but what form that takes will depend on personnel - more news next time.

Trinity Sunday 15th June, also **RSCM Music Sunday**, will both be marked in Gamlingay at the morning service. The usual Everton congregation is otherwise occupied on this day, so there will be no service there. At Great Gransden there is a 'Come and Sing' evensong - click here to see the poster, to which all are invited and to which Hilary can offer lifts.


